In the communities around our church, it can get very hot and dry during the summer months. This past summer was no exception. We experienced several days where the temof 107 degrees and higher! I think the words from the Apostle Paul can certainly be our guide as we are coming out of a very hot dry summer and into the fall season which started with a devastating hurricane named Matthew. Paul reminds us, "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you, (IThess. 5:18). Those words are a true Christ honoring spirit of gratitude!

In his letters, the Apostle Paul helps us to develop a theology of gratitude. He wrote about thanksgiving more often than any other New Testament author. From the 23 times he used perature rose to 100 degrees with heat indexes the word, we learn a few lessons about thanksgiving...

> Thanksgiving was always directed toward God and never toward people. People are gifts from God, and Paul thanked God for their growth. love, and faith. He wrote, "I thank my God always on your behalf, for the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ," (I Cor. thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers."

Thanksgiving is given through Jesus for everything (Col. 3:15-17), "And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts. For as members of one body you are called to live in peace. And always be thankful. Let the message about Christ, in all its richness, fill your lives. Teach and counsel each other with all the wisdom he gives. Sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs to God with thankful hearts.
