Here is a wonderful soul-searing article on Growin in God's Will...
"3 Mistakes to Avoid when Seeking God's Will"

We may think we are at a dead end in our life, for example, "We are never going to get out of debt!" "I'm never going to have a baby." "My dream is never going to come true." "How is it 2. ever going to work out?"

Right now, it may look dark and we may feel defeated and things may seem like a mystery to us. But one day we are going to see in the light of eternity how it all fits together in God's plan! Until then, there are 3 mistakes we need to avoid as we seek God's will. As we avoid these mistakes, we will develop deeper trust in God, even when we do not understand—-

 Do not be FATALISTIC. The idea of fatalism is the idea that everything is out of our control and we are powerless to do anything about it which leads to self-pity. It causes us to blame God for everything bad in our lives rather than accepting responsibility when we cause problems.

Fatalism leads to passivity. It makes us think, "I'm waiting on God to bring me a spouse" or "I'm waiting on God to get me a job." God is saying, "I gave you a brain! I

gave you two feet. Get out and do something about it!"

2. Do not be FRUSTRATED. If we try to figure out everything in our life, we are going to be very frustrated. Sometimes we are going to do what we think is God's will, and it is going to fail. "I thought God was leading me to start this business, but it failed."

What do we do when there are no answers! We keep trusting God, knowing that He is working on our character through all of our circumstances and that He has good plans for us.

3. Don't be FEARFUL. What is behind the fear of God's will? The root problem is that we doubt God's love. The Bible says, "There is no fear in love; but perfect love (Jesus Christ) casts out fear." (1 John 4:18). We always get into trouble when we doubt God's love, because when we do not trust Him, we do not obey Him.

Twists and turns occur along the journey of believer's lives from time to time that we often have no control over. Things can get quite messy and have the potential of discouraging us or making us bitter. Also, we are encouraged by *Philippians 4:7* which says, "And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."
