The nets are \$10 each, but \$10 covers so much more...\$6 goes toward the net, \$1 goes toward the transportation of the net from the capitol city to the Yendi Villages, \$2 provides health education through local nurses and public health workers, and \$1 goes to assisting church planters with ministries in the villages, providing Bibles and a set of drums.
