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## CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT (CI) COMMITTEE UPDATE

The CI committee is pleased to announce that we are nearing completion of Phase 2 based on our phased approach to improving the infrastructure at GPBC. The most recent update has been the small kitchen near the Narthex. We continue to be humbled by your support and encouragement through this multi-year process. In addition, we are very grateful to the Building and Grounds Committee through this process.

The final phase of improvements (Phase 3), initially planned by the CI committee and presented for church approval several years ago, envisioned an outdoor shelter to service picnics, sports camps, etc. In the interim period, we have continued to study evolving facility use and needs and we have received valuable insights from membership as well. Thus, the CI committee would like to propose that the church body consider two options for Phase 3:

- Phase 3A—Continue with the original plan to update the existing fellowship hall and kitchen and construct an outdoor shelter based on availability of funds.
- Phase 3B—Build an addition to the existing fellowship hall to serve larger capacity functions and to provide additional flexibility to meet the needs of GPBC. (Having an airconditioned/heated environment instead of an outdoor shelter was indicated higher priority by a number of members than an outdoor space).

On June 14, 2017 at 6:30pm, a called business meeting will be held to discuss the options above. Please be on the lookout for more detailed information in the Narthex about the called business meeting. Mark your calendars now and plan to attend.
