Valentine's Day ... A Real Love Connection

I trust as Valentine Day approaches; our thoughts turn to the word "love". Love might bring to mind a familiar phrase: "Love is patient, love is kind, love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres...".

We have heard these words recited in wedding ceremonies or seen them written on Valentine's Day cards. They are found in I Corinthians 13.

Love never fails... we have heard someone say, "I love you," but a happy ending did not follow. In fact, I Corinthians 13 teaches that we must connect to love, specifically the love of God, in order to live meaningful lives.

Valentine's Day recognizes a holiday of taking time to show affection, to bring a little more meaning into everyday actions. Instead of mentioning romance in **I Corinthians 13**, the great love chapter teaches about the love of God: agape love, which is: everlasting, unconditional and unselfish love. His love is available to anyone who will yield their hearts and lives to Him.

On one version of a popular reality TV show, a single man meets several single women. As he gets to know them a little better, he eliminates the women he is not interested in. That sounds cruel, but it is all done in the name of "love" ... and entertainment.

God does not line people up, inspect them, and then reject the ones He does not like because that is not what real love does. The Bible says, "Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall

see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known" (I Cor. 13:12).

Billy Graham says, "No matter what sin you have committed, no matter how dirty, shameful or terrible it may be, God loves you. You may be at the very gate of hell itself, but God loves you with an everlasting love."

The Bible says God is love. God does not simply profess His love in words. God proves His love in action, "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

Jesus Christ's sacrifice represents the ultimate act of love because it shows God's grace. Christ is not just a good person who did good things for people and then was willing to die for His actions. Christ died in order to bring people closer to God.

I Corinthians 13 challenges us to do everything out of love, specifically the kind of love that God has shown through Jesus. Love is the motive. That means loving friends, enemies, neighbors, co-workers, spouses, children, parents, and even strangers with the merciful and selfless love that comes from God.

GPBC members showed their Love for Jesus by helping those who needed it most, in helping the homeless.


We can show GOD's love everyday by showing kindness and Love to anyone we come in contact with, by giving encouragement to one another.


