"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them and...teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you..." Amen. Matthew 28:19-20

Easter 2019 Did we know: Easter is the most important and oldest festival of the Christian Church, celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ and held (in the Western Church) between March 22 and April 25, on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the northern spring equinox.

Easter denotes the celebration of our Lord's resurrection from the tomb! Resurrection means a "raising up", or "rising up" from the Greek word ANASTASIS. In the verb form it means "to cause to stand or rise up; to raise from sleep or from the dead." The resurrection of the dead is one of the most basic of doctrines; and we accept it as fact that Jesus Christ, the Messiah not only suffered and died for the sins of the world, but that He subsequently rose from the grave by the power of Almighty God, His Father!

In New Testament times, 2 witnesses were required to give an affirmative testimony before a certain event could be validated. How many people does the Bible say gave an affirmative witness of the resurrected Lord Jesus Christ?

Scripture tells us Jesus appeared over some 40 days to the women at His tomb, to Peter, and to His brother James. He also appeared in the upper room to His followers without Thomas and the next week to the Twelve including Thomas. He appeared to 2 followers on the road to Emmaus and their families, to His disciples with Peter at the Sea of Galilee, and to some 500 followers in **I Corinthians 15:5-8**.

Jesus appeared to MANY more than the Jewish Law required.

Did Jesus appear to his earthly mother? Maybe he did! **Mark 16** and **Luke 24** name some of the women at the tomb on Resurrection Sunday. Among them is "Mary the mother of James." This probably was not Jesus' mother, but she may have been present. First century believers knew Jesus had existed long before Mary conceived Him, and this was written later when James, the half-brother of Jesus, was the leader of the Jerusalem church.

Again, when Jesus appeared to Cleopas and another person on the Emmaus Road that first Easter, **Luke 24** says He went home with them for supper. Since **John 19:25** says Mary had a sister married to Cleopas, it is very likely Mary and Jesus' siblings were staying there for Passover. If so, they saw him at supper and again later that evening when they gathered in the Upper Room (without Thomas). We do know, according to **Acts 1:14**, that all his family were saved and present when the Spirit came at Pentecost.

Jesus had reasons to appear to Mary Magdalene, Peter, James, and many other followers. But, He had already broken ties with his earthly mother at the Cross when He entrusted her to John. Besides, knowing how people would esteem Mary, He did not need to spotlight her again. Maybe He did appear to Mary, but we have no specific record of it.

Invest in Someone

After returning from the Journey Retreat with the youth in March, there were a few things I wanted to share that we learned in the adult sessions that could help our church grow. Statistically, 7 out of 10 youth that attend a church youth group leave after they graduate high school and do not return, essentially leaving their faith behind. That's an alarming statistic, but there are ways we can combat church dropouts.

First, choose to invest in someone. The 3 out of 10 youth that choose to stay faithful have, on average, five adult friends that keep them interested in coming back to church. Those who do not have adult friends find it difficult to come back after graduation because they have no connections with the church outside of the youth group and feel out of place.

Second, take an interest in what they are interested in. Too often, we want the youth of today to conform with our standards and interests, but why not take the initiative and find out what they like? We are the adults after all. We may be able to help them form connections for a future career or we might simply enjoy their company.

Third, help them find who they are. The youth of today are hungry to find who they are and what they are meant to do in this life. Having more support along the way can make a strong impression on them and keep them coming back for more.

Regardless of what the news tells you about the youth of today, they are very headstrong and driven to make a positive impact in the world. Instead of being a roadblock in their way, let's choose to reach out and be there for them in their formative years so they will grow to be the young men and women God has called them to be.
