Mother's Day

Please read Ephesians 6: 1-3, Proverbs 31: 10 - 31

What is a mother? Mothering is much more than giving birth. It is a serious responsibility when God blesses women with the responsibility of being a mother. Mothering is creating an environment that causes a child to live well. It means caring, feeding, loving, nurturing, encouraging and protecting. It means giving quality and value to life. Normally we receive our sense of self disciple, sensitivity, tenderness, and emotional stability from our mothers. In many cases how valuable she is would include we get strength, work ethics, and physical development from our fathers. Children are fortunate when their mother or father instill these qualities in them.

Motherhood is what Solomon had in mind in Proverbs 31: 10 - 31. Also, in Exodus 20:12, Moses said, "Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you". Mothers are very special and invaluable. Some things are produced routinely and may not be worth much. Other things have a lasting beauty, are reliable and durable and have value.

Motherhood is a treasure beyond description. Good mothers are like diamonds. They are beautiful, durable, and limited in number. Every mother is one of a kind and has eternal value.

In Ephesians Paul picked up on the only commandment that carries a promise. Children who have a good relationship with their parents enjoy a better quality of life than those who do not. Paul says we should honor our mothers. The word honor literally means to esteem, to value as precious. It also means to pay appropriate tribute to the ones who have done special things. Some of the ways of paying tribute and showing our mother treating her with respect. Pay attention to her opinions even if you disagree. Show gratitude for the things she has done for you. Take time for her especially as she grows older. Jesus honored his mother Mary even as He hung on the Cross. One of the last things Jesus did on earth was to take care of His mother! God is exalted when the world sees us demonstrating respect and honor for our mothers.






