Father's Day

Psalm 103:1-13

In Psalm 103, David speaks of God, our Heavenly Father. The character traits that make a good father originated from God. If we were designing a Biblical father, these are the merits we would desire.

David lists some of these qualities in Psalm 103. Verse 2 says, "Forget not all his benefits." A good earthly father provides for every area in the lives of his children. In verse 3, the Father works to correct the weaknesses in our lives. In verse 4, life is raised to its highest possibility. In verse 5, the psalmist emphasizes that the Father enables us to find renewal. In verses 8 – 10 we read that the Father is merciful and kind. The most beautiful part of David's description is found in verse 13. In the same way that a father is tender and sympathetic, so is God. All earthly fathers should focus on letting these qualities become a part of their lives.

Here is a list of 10 qualities of a good father.

- 1. He keeps the family safe
- 2. He spends quality time with his children
- 3. He sets examples of good behavior
- 4. He is loyal, reliable and supportive
- 5. He enforces rules that are fair and consistent
- 6. He teaches his children grit and how to be self-reliant

- 7. He makes sure his family has all the necessities of life
- 8. He is open minded and understands that every child is different
- 9. He provides opportunities for children to learn and grow
- 10. He gives unconditional love

But the most important quality is for a father to be a Christian and share his faith with his family! When a father properly fulfills his role in the family, he is fulfilling a picture of our Heavenly Father's relationship to his children.

The Bible teaches us, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved." *John 3:16–17*

As earthly fathers we are not perfect, but we can strive to be like God the Father. God is a perfect Father. Not only are His thoughts and character perfect, but as Psalm. 18:30 says, "As for God, his way is perfect: The LORD's word is flawless; he shields all who take refuge in him."

I pray for our Fathers to lead us to take refuge in our Heavenly Father!
