Valentine's Day will be arriving soon. On February 14th our minds will turn to the emotion of love. How can one human love another human? Well, science and psychology have their explanations, however, I believe the Bible has the best answer....

How can it be so easy to get wrapped up in the sweet celebration of love for each other that we forget where love really came from? The Bible says, "*We love each other because He first loved us,*" (I John 4:19).

I read where someone wrote; "Valentine's Day does not have to be just about us. If we are as intentional about loving God as we are about loving each other, the whole day can still bring glory to God." The Bible says. "Whatever is good and perfect comes down to us from God our Father, who created all the lights in the heavens," (James 1:17).

Here are 3 Ways to Honor God on Valentine's Day:

1. Make a list of the ways He has shown His love for us. *"For God so loved the world that He gave us His only* begotten son, that whoever believes in Him will not perish but have everlasting life, " (John 3:16). God GAVE His love to us through Jesus Christ, so let us RECEIVE His free gift and live our lives to please Him.

2. Do good in the world. "Never walk away from someone who needs help; for you may be the hand of God to that person," (Proverbs 3:27). SHARE God's love with those in need. Be His hands and share His love with someone else.

3. Love each other. "So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you should love one another," (John 13:34). Love your loved ones! Call them often and go visit them! On Valentine's Day, do something special for your spouse AND let other family members see the love of Jesus reflected through you!

God's love is always all around us, so share God's love with those around us!

<u>Agape</u>

On a 2007 trip to Athens Greece, Leslie and I had an opportunity to visit Corinth and see the agora (marketplace) where Paul worked making tents with Aquila and Priscilla. A few years later, while Paul was in Ephesus, he wrote a letter to the church he founded in Corinth. As Leslie and I neared Corinth, we stopped at a small church and discovered a large marble monument with writing on four sides. On each side of the monument, in Greek, Macedonian, English, and French, part of Paul's letter to Corinth was inscribed:



"If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient and kind; love is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in the right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things". I Corinthians 13:1-7

Chapter 13 of 1 Corinthians is known as the 'LOVE' chapter of the Bible. Since February is the month our culture celebrates LOVE, Paul's words, inspired by God, have a lot to say to us on the subject this month. The Greeks have four words for love: **Storge** – affection of parent to child; **Eros**–sexual or erotic love; **Phile**–love between friends; and **Agape**–unconditional love towards others. Paul used the word $\dot{\alpha}\gamma\dot{\alpha}\pi\eta$ (**agape**) throughout chapter 13. In fact, in verse 13 he says "And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love."

How can love be greater than our faith and hope? Because our faith is founded on the agape form of love that God has for us. What is unconditional love, how do we express it towards others? It is the love for one another that God shows toward us *"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."* John 3:16. God gave us His Son, Jesus. That's REAL agape: true unconditional love.

As you go about this month and see all the heart shaped boxes of candies, the red cards and flowers, remember <u>Christians are to express the kind of love for one another that God shows toward us.</u>


