Easter 2020

I enjoyed reading some excerpts from the <u>2020</u> <u>Farmer's Almanac</u>. I came across an article on Easter, I thought their reporting on Easter dates was interesting and helpful. I have also added the significance of Easter to a Christian.

WHY DO WE CELEBRATE EASTER? Easter celebrates Christ's resurrection from the dead, following His crucifixion! The resurrection represents the triumph of good over evil, sin, death, and the physical body.

WHEN IS EASTER 2020? This year, Easter will be observed on **Sunday**, **April 12**. Easter's date is just **5 days** after April's Full Moon (Tuesday, April 7), which is the first full moon of spring, known in the Christian calendar as the "**Paschal Full Moon**."

WHAT WILL BE FUTURE EASTER DATES? Easter is a "movable feast" and does not have a fixed date; however, it is always held on a Sunday between March 22 and April 25. Therefore, in 2020 Eater Sunday will be Aril 12 ... 2021 Easter will be April 4 ...and in 2022 Easter will be April 17. If you want more dates, check out the Almanac's dates all the way to the year 2299!

The Almanac says it this way: In 2020, the spring equinox will happen on Thursday, March 19. The first full moon to occur after that date rises the night of Tuesday, April 7. Therefore, Easter will be observed on the subsequent Sunday, April 12.

On Christian calendars, the first full moon of spring is called the "Paschal (Passover) Full Moon." So, Easter is observed on the Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon.

WHERE DID THE WORD "EASTER" COME FROM?

Easter, also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday. Pascha (Latin) which comes directly from Pesach, the Hebrew word for Passover. Going back to the story of the first Passover, Moses tells the Israelites to slaughter a Passover lamb and paint its blood on their door post. The Lord protected the Israelites from death by passing over their doors and would not "allow the death angel to enter your houses to strike you down" (Ex. 12:23).

In the New Testament (I Corinthians 5:7), Paul connects the resurrected Christ to the Passover. He refers to Jesus as the paschal lamb who has been sacrificed for his people's salvation. Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples during Passover, so it makes sense that the Feast of the Resurrection is connected with the Jewish holiday.

The exact origin of the word "Easter" is unclear. Some historians suggest that it came from the Latin phrase for "white week," used to describe the white garments new Christians wore when they were baptized during Holy Week.

Easter may have formed in an old German word for "east," which in turn is derived from a Latin word for "dawn." In the past, the word Easter could mean "to turn toward the east" or "rising."

Personally, it is unimportant if Easter comes from the German or Latin language. For me, Easter is a Christian holiday to celebrate Christ's resurrection ... and the reminder that His death and resurrection brings NEW life to all who believe by Faith in Jesus Christ!
