"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them and...teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you..."

Amen. Matthew 28:19-20

July 2020

What are some important dates that stand out in our minds: good times together as a family --- a trip we took --- your favorite team winning the big game --- receiving our high school or college diploma --- paying off our car or house loan --- our wedding day --- birth of our children --- and especially the day we were saved by Jesus Christ!

July 4, 1776 is a date that stands out in our nation's mind. It is the date we declared our Independence from Great Britain! On this date, we saw ourselves no longer as the "Colonies" of Great Britain but as the new sovereign nation called, "The United States of America!"

There is another national date that is significant, but does not receive the attention as July 4th. I would like to share the following information from an article I read some time ago.

The American Revolution began in 1775. In the summer of 1775, the United States had yet to declare its independence from Great Britain when the Continental Army launched an invasion of the neighboring British colony of Canada. Setting out to seize Quebec City, the patriots hoped to gain a strategic location on the St. Lawrence River and recruit French-Canadians to join their rebellion.

Colonel Benedict Arnold marched his forces north through the deep woods of Maine and in December 1775 met up on the outskirts of Quebec City with General Richard Montgomery's men who had proceeded up Lake Champlain and seized Montreal. With the enlistments of many of his men expiring on New Year's Day, Arnold was forced to launch a

desperate attack on December 31, 1775, during the middle of a blizzard.

The assault failed miserably, and Montgomery was among the dozens killed in the Battle of Quebec. The Continental Army eventually retreated from Canada, and in 1780 Arnold notoriously switched sides to join with the British.

July 4th is also an important date due to deaths and birthdays that have occurred. The Fourth of July saw the death of three of the first five U.S. presidents: John Adams and Thomas Jefferson in 1826 and James Monroe in 1831. Calvin Coolidge was the only chief executive born on Independence Day. The 30th President was born on July 4, 1872 in the small hamlet of Plymouth Notch, Vermont. While serving as Vice President, Coolidge was at the family homestead in the early morning hours of August 3, 1923 when the shocking news of the sudden death of President Warren G. Harding arrived. By the light of a kerosene lamp in the family's parlor, Coolidge's father administered the oath of office to his son.

Perhaps we can look at other people born on July 4th in a later newsletter. For now, as much as I enjoy history, **THE MOST** important date in our lives is the day we were saved through faith in Jesus Christ! Our nation was moved by a passion for freedom from England. Our Savior and Lord was moved by compassion to come to us and save us from Satan's tyranny. Please be safe this upcoming holiday, but also, let us reflect on the day Jesus saved us from our sins!
