"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them and...teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you..."

"Know Where to Look"

How many times have we misplaced an item? Let's use our car keys for an example. When we realize we have misplaced them, we might say to someone, "I have lost my car keys!" That person typically will ask *THAT* question, "Where did you have them last?" *THEN*, I typically respond, "If I knew where to look, then my keys would not be lost!

"Know Where to Look," can be a powerful theme of Easter's Message. Jesus said in (Luke 22:42), "Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me; nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done." Was Jesus trying to get out of His mission? NO! It is never wrong to express our feelings to our Heavenly Father. Jesus is teaching us that He dreaded His coming illegal trial, persecution, and painful death. In this passage, He is reaffirming His commitment to do whatever His Father wanted.

The "cup" Jesus spoke of meant the terrible agony He knew He would endure, not only the pain of the Cross but, worse, the total separation from His Father. This was what Jesus was going to experience on the night of His betrayal as He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane. He was going to die the following morning for the world's sin!

What could Jesus have done? He could have confided in His disciples ... He could have called forth a Heavenly Prayer Meeting ... BUT ... when the time came for Him to face fear, where did He look? Jesus looked first to His Father!

Do we "Know Where to Look"? Do we tend to look everywhere else before we go to our Heavenly Father? Before we go seeking help from our family or friends, let us follow Jesus' example. The first one to hear Jesus' fear was His Father in Heaven!

Rev. Max Lucado wrote, "A millennium earlier King David said, 'I will fear no evil,' (Psalm 23:4). David knew where to look. Rather than turn to the other sheep. David turned to the Shepherd. Rather than stare at the problems, he stared at the rod and staff. Because he knew where to look David was able to say, 'I will fear no evil.'"

"During the Easter Season, let us proclaim that we, "Know Where to Look." We *WILL* look to our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ! Let us look first to Jesus *THEN*, we too, can boldly proclaim, "I will fear no evil."

Guarding Against Doubt

Do you doubt your salvation? The Bible says quite plainly that Jesus is able to save forever those who draw near to GOD through Him, since He's always interceding for them in heaven (Heb 7:25). SATAN Is an accuser, who constantly reminds us of our sin and shame, but Paul assures us that no one can bring a charge against GOD"S elect (Rom. 8:33-34).

Don't let negative influences undermine your confidence in Christ's ability to save and keep you forever. When doubts come, cling to these truths and boldly proclaim what the Bible says.
