"Prayer of Encouragement"

A devotional article from Dennis DeHaan got me to thinking about prayer. As we celebrate our nation's independence on July 4th, I encourage us to first pray for ourselves then let us lift up our nation in prayer. Please read Psalm 51.

DeHaan begins: When Robert Louis Stevenson was a boy, he once remarked to his mother, "Momma, you can't be good without praying." His mother responded, "How do you know, Robert?" He replied, "Because I've tried!"

DeHaan continued with an additional illustration: This brings to mind a story about another little fellow – one who had been sent to his room because he had been bad. A short time later he came out and said to his mother, "I've been thinking nation to seek God's mercy, acknowledge about what I did, and I said a prayer." "That's fine," said his mother, "if you ask God to make you good, He will help you." "Oh, I didn't ask Him to help me to be good, I asked Him to help you put up with me."

Perhaps we have prayed for the Lord to adjust our conditions or change people. I think, instead of asking our Lord to deal with situations or other people, we might

just want to pray asking Him to deal with us. DeHaan referenced a quote by A.W. Tozer: "Until man has gotten into trouble with his heart, he is not likely to get out of trouble with God."

Praying for Spiritual Growth becomes effective only when we seek personal forgiveness with the Lord. David's prayer in Psalm 51 is a wonderful example for where prayer is to begin. David asked for mercy (v.1), acknowledges his sin (v.3), sought a clean heart (v.10), and requested that the joy of his salvation be restored (v.12). I like the way DeHaan stated David's prayer attitude: "David made no excuses."

When we follow the Bible's instructions for prayer to begin with ourselves, then we can pray for our nation's needs. Through prayer, let us encourage our our sins, seek to clean our hearts, and request restoration of our nation's salvation.

I believe prayers based upon Psalm 51 will be an encouragement to all people and will bring glory to our Lord. Let us make "no excuses" to pray for ourselves and our nation!

The Preamble

While walking through our Gloucester Walmart parking lot this week I noticed a truck cab. it's back window decorated with our country's flag. In the forefront were those boldly scrolled words "We The People". These sacred words begin the preamble to the Constitution of the United States. Our forefathers penned this document 234 years ago, but it still applies to our precious country today.

"We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union,

establish Justice. insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity,

do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."

I wondered what a Preamble statement for followers of Christ would look like today, in the face of controversy and pressure to assimilate to the current, ever changing and often immoral values. To disagree with popular opinion is matched with shaming and threats. Our national laws are changing quickly, and God's people are now being put to the test. How do we stand fast in the onslaught of cultural pressure to accept a "world view" the Word of God tells us is wrong?

Let me encourage you, my precious family with these words:

We the People of Christ, in Order to form a more perfect Union with Him, recognize that:

Only God can establish true Justice. Our lives are judged by our acceptance and adherence to Jesus. (John 3:18 "Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.") ESV

Only God can insure genuine Tranquility. (John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.") ESV

Only God can provide for the common, (and supernatural) defense. He fights for us (Joshua 1:9. "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go.") ESV
