Pastor Search Update

GPBC's Pastor Search Committee has been working since late March 2022 to discern God's will in calling the next Pastor of Gloucester Point Baptist. After receiving training from the Baptist General Association of Virginia (BGAV) [field Strategist Brian Williams], the Pastor Search Team (PST) developed profiles for our church, community, and next Pastor based on the church wide survey conducted in May. These profiles and an application for the GPBC Pastor opening were placed on our website (gloptbaptist.org) and advertised through many different seminaries, Baptist news outlets, the BGAV, and the Southern Baptist Convention.

As of Oct 15, 2022, we have received 22 resumes. With all the advances in digital communications since the last pastor search for GPBC, the PST now receives and evaluates the candidate's worship service videos, church websites, and other digital media as part of the resume review process.

The survey you completed last May has helped us understand the Church's desires for the next Pastor. In addition, we are constantly seeking to discern God's will as we review candidate information. We anticipate interviewing several top-tier candidates very soon.

We especially appreciate the church's focused 31 Days of Prayer, and we continue to ask

for your prayers during the search process. We are confident God has already selected our next Pastor. Now we must be patient for His timing and obedient to His will in GPBC's Pastor search.
